Objective: To explore the story of Daniel’s friends, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, and what we can learn from their bravery and faith.

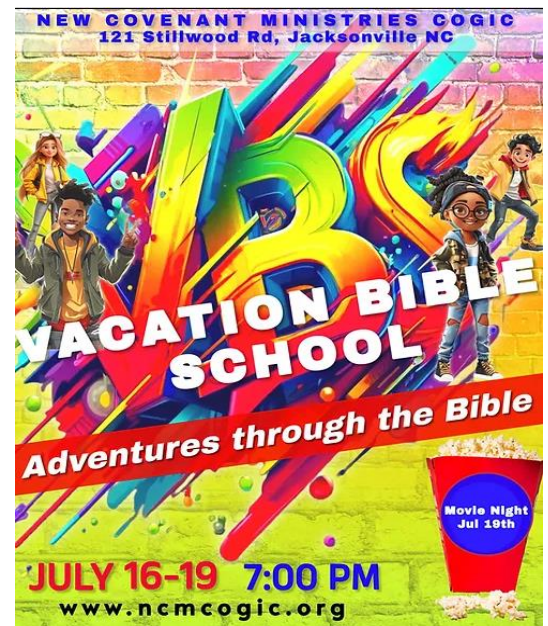
Background Story:
