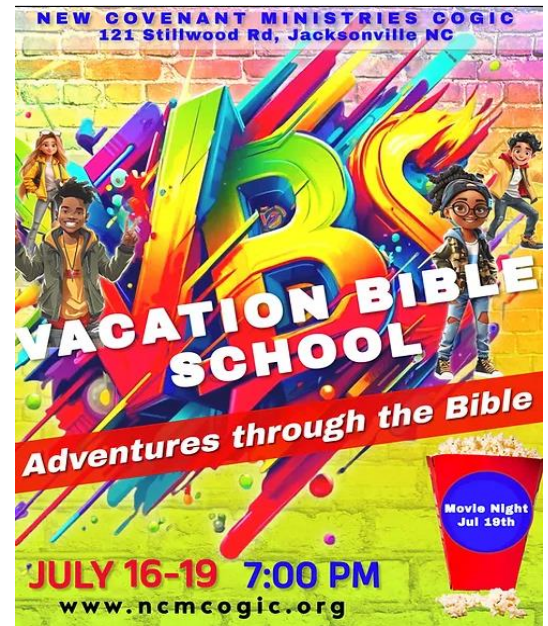

Day 2 – Senior Lesson

Title: Mephibosheth's Unexpected Blessing

Scripture: 2 Samuel, Chapter 4 and 9
